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PRESIDENTS REPORT 2023

It is my pleasure to report on the achievements of the members and presenters of Monaro Community Radio for the year ending June 2023.

We have made some fantastic inroads into studio improvements this year as well as consolidating the great work done by our members in the past.

We have purchased and installed new mixers into each of our Cooma studios and we have replaced the Nimmitabel studio mixer with one of the former and refurbished mixers from Cooma. The funding for the new mixers was made possible by grant funding through the Boco Rock Community Fund. We now have a compact but complete outside broadcasting unit which was assembled by Dave Miller and was partially funded by a volunteers equipment grant (to purchase a laptop computer for outside broadcasting) supported by our Federal member Kirsty McBain. Dave also donated a considerable portion of the equipment needed to set up the unit. We have received considerable grant funding which will be detailed in Kerry Rooney's Grants Officer Report. We purchased new computers for our 2 Cooma studios due to the former units reaching their use by date. A further computer upgrade will be necessary for our main broadcast control computer.

Financially, we have been able to hold our own this year despite the increasing cost of power and consumables due to the financial management of our Treasurer Pat Booker, thanks Pat. Our Treasurers report details our financial position which is healthy at this time despite having less sponsors this year compared to last. Fundraising has been undertaken once again by our regulars and I sincerely thank David Browne, Fay Freebody and Dave Miller for their great contribution in delivering a better than expected funding result to augment our funds. We held a very successful country music fundraiser again this year which was greatly supported by local artists who donated their time for the event.

PRESIDENTS REPORT continued

The audience was of a similar size as last years indicating the support of our community and the love of country music in our districts.

Our programming has been a thin this year with some presenters unable to do their regular spots due to illness. Our listeners really enjoy programs being presented live and so it is pleasing to see other presenters willing to take on additional spots. Of course we always have our back up music available for the times live presenters or fill in presenters are unavailable.

Our technical team, Dave, Harry and Bill have once again delivered the goods by keeping our station on air and relatively trouble free. We had an issue with our Bombala transmitter affected by water ingress but with the construction of a new roof over the cabinet and the affected transmitter repaired, seems to have solved the problem. The standby transmitter which was used in Bombala needs to be serviced/repaired and we really need to purchase a standby transmitter for our translator sites.

Possibly, our most pressing issue which will need to be addressed in the coming year is the lack of storage space in our Cooma studio. We resolved to construct a storage facility at the back of the studio to allow us to de-clutter our equipment room and kitchen.

I thank David Browne who, as vice president and the "in town" go to person for his support, all of our office bearers and coordinators for their ongoing commitment to the success of our station and of course all of our presenters who have willingly continued to deliver quality broadcasting.

Treasurers report to AGM August 2023

The statement of financial position and statement of cash flows for the financial year to 30 June 2023 are attached.

Some features of the accounts are:

- 1. Total revenue \$57785, expenses were \$57418. Cash at bank has grown from \$69536 to \$69903.
- 2. Net assets after depreciation are valued at \$189854, an increase from \$180805 in the previous year.
- 3. Income from sponsors of \$19721 was achieved this year, compared to \$26016 last year. The number of sponsors each month has averaged 17.
- 4. Fundraising of \$7674 was achieved, again a very good achievement.
- 5. Grant income provided \$21459, comprised of:
- \$10112 CBF D&O (Transmission Expenses) grant 2022/23
- \$11346 Boco Rock Community Fund
- 6. Major donations received were:

Cooma ExServices Club \$2897

Snowy Monaro Regional council \$500

Hinton family \$650

- 7. GST payment of \$84 was made to the ATO.
- 8. Cash at bank is held at ANZ \$308, Bendigo Bank \$3701, AMP \$10894, ME Bank Term Deposit 1 \$30000, ME Bank Term Deposit 2 \$25000.

Comments

An overall successful financial result was achieved this year, maintaining a healthy cash balance while providing a number of asset improvements to enhance the ongoing operation of the association. Financial support was provided by fundraising efforts, achievement of grants and ongoing support from sponsors. Thanks to all members involved in contributing to those outcomes.

There are no current liabilities.

Our principal business banking activity has now switched to Bendigo Bank which now incorporates our previous provider Service One Alliance Bank.

A draft budget for 2023/2024 is provided, which anticipates an end of year cash position further improved by approximately \$9000. This projection relies on no major capital expenses (unless grant funded).

My thanks to the committee executive and members for their support and cooperation throughout the year as we look forward to a successful 2023/24.

2MNO Technical Report for 2022 – 2023.

Dave Miller, Harry Salmela covered a lot of ground this year sorting out issues with our studios and transmitters. The main transmitter at Mt Emerald suffered damage due to power surge and or lightning and was replaced with back up equipment. The transmitter was replaced with new equipment. Faults developed at the Bombala transmission site due to poor equipment protection with the transmitter replaced with standby equipment. The site has been improved for better equipment protection since the problems were noted.

During the early part of 2023, increasing intermittant problems were evident with CD players in Cooma Studios 1 & 2. These were replaced with more reliable machines. Problems were also happening with a Sonifex mixer, both mixers were replaced with new units. One repaired unit became a spare backup item, the other mixer replaced a standby unit at Nimmitabel Studio.

Station policy with regard to maintenance and servicing has been set to ensure that we have spare backup capability for all transmitters and studio operational equipment. This policy has been in place for a long time now and has proved to be effective as we experience issues with equipment faults and failure.

We have not resolved the potential problems at the Mt Emerald site, the antenna structure and cable terminations in the transmitter building. The situation is complex and requires further thought and possible action.

Technical report continued

A reminder of the extent of facilities operated by 2MNO, three radio studios, two in Cooma and one at Nimmitabel; four transmitters covering a large part of South East NSW, Mt Emerald, our main transmitter, Cooma , Bombala and Kalkite and Jindabyne) . You will appreciate the scope of the Technical Team's responsibilities with the great variety of equipment in service . You can of course be of great assistance to the team by knowing the function of the operating switches and buttons on the mixing desk, computers and CD players. Dave, Harry and Bill are always very happy to assist.

Your technical team, Dave Miller, Harry Samela and Bill Steptoe have travelled a lot and sorted out a large range of operational, software and other technical issues to keep us on air during the year, they will continue to work to keep things going,
