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PRESIDENTS REPORT 2024 AGM

It is my great pleasure to report on the achievements of the operations of our community radio 2MNO for the past year.

Thanks to the efforts of our hardworking fundraising group and the astute efforts of our Treasurer Pat Booker, we have ended the year in a very sound financial position which sets us up nicely for the projects we will need to attend to in the coming 12 months. We have outgrown our Cooma studio and will need to further our endeavors for a storage area at the rear of our building to house broadcast equipment and our fundraising equipment.

Following Richard Mackays passing, his family has donated his radio antennae to 2MNO. The mast will be a replacement for our existing antennae on Mt Emerald which is unsafe for technicians to work on.

We have been very successful once again with our grant funding applications thanks to the hard work of Pat Booker and Kerry Rooney.

We welcomed 2 new presenters this year, Bernard Rooney and Melinda Kalac. It's great to have new presenters join us to add to the diversity of our programming and swells our presenter ranks just a little bit. Our presenters age profile is at a point where we really need many more people to allow for when some of us have passed their use by date and for our station to flourish we need to attract more members and particularly younger presenters. It is always healthier to have presenters looking for spots rather than spots looking for presenters. I encourage all of our members to get friends and relatives involved in our station.

Our outside broadcasts have been well received this term with us broadcasting from the National Busking Championships in Cooma and also the Bombala Markets.

I thank all our technicians and presenters who worked with great skill to pull off these broadcasts. We have been invited to broadcast the Bombala heat of the National Busking Championships in September 2024.

We have promoted an additional country music concert as a fundraiser at the Cooma Car Club in April 2024. This concert featured Dianne Lindsay and Peter Simpson and our wonderful local music artists Ernie Constance and Jay Podger. All the artists donated their time to perform wonderful shows in support of our station. The concert was performed in a packed house which indicates the support we have by the artists and our locals as well.

We have an additional concert planned for September this year which will feature all the local artists that our country music audience love to hear.

I sincerely thank all of our members who have been actively engaged in presenting their programs, technicians for keeping us on air and help us to provide entertainment for our listeners and our fundraising group. Sincere thanks also to the members who clean up after us and provide a clean and tidy workplace and maintain our building and equipment. Thanks also to Vice President, David Browne for his assistance being the "in town" contact person.

Monaro Community Kadio Treasurers report to AGM August 2024

The statement of financial position and statement of cash flows for the financial year to 30 June 2024 are attached.

Some features of the accounts are:

- 1. Total revenue \$49348, expenses were \$27433. Cash at bank has grown from \$69903 to \$91818.
- 2. Net assets after depreciation are valued at \$205411, an increase from \$189854 in the previous year.
- 3. Income from sponsors of \$21400 was achieved this year, compared to \$19721 last year. The number of sponsors each month has averaged 17.
- 4. Fundraising of \$5138 was achieved, again a very good result.
- 5. Grant income provided \$11969, being the CBF D&O (Transmission Expenses) grant 2023/24
- 6. Major donations received were: Snowy Mountains Regional Council rates contribution \$1000 and \$1500 Essential Energy Community Choices Program \$1250 Hinton family \$655 Bronnie Kolano \$500
- 7. GST payment of \$16 was made to the ATO.
- 8. Cash at bank is held at Bendigo Bank \$9557, AMP \$17261, ME Bank Term Deposit 1 \$30000, ME Bank Term Deposit 2 \$35000.

Comments

An overall successful financial result was achieved this year, supplementing a healthy cash balance while maintaining assets to enhance the ongoing operation of the association. Financial support was provided by fundraising efforts, achievement of grants/donations and ongoing support from sponsors. Thanks to all members involved in contributing to those outcomes.

There are no current liabilities.

A draft budget for 2024/2025 is provided, which anticipates an end of year cash position further improved by approximately \$13000. This projection relies on no major capital expenses (unless grant funded).

My thanks to the committee executive and members for their support and cooperation throughout the year as we look forward to a successful 2024/25.

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GRANTS REPORT 2023-24

The **Essential Energy** grant involved a lot of online clicking to get a result. Thanks to our supportive members and listeners who voted for us at the time. As a result, 2MNO came fourth and received a grant of \$1,250 in August 2023. This funding is earmarked to contribute to a shed to store fundraising equipment.

In FY2023-24 2MNO received two grant payments from the Snowy Monaro Regional Council: \$1,000 in July 2023 and another \$1,500 in June 2024. These grants have helped offset 2MNO's water charges and rates over a two-year period. This was the final year of the Council's **Donations and Sponsorships** program and we thank them for their support.

We missed out on the **Volunteers Grant** for 2023-24. There were 60 expressions of interest from Eden-Monaro and 24 were funded. We were seeking funding of just under \$5,000 for a transmitter and a computer.

In June 2024 we submitted a grant application for \$4,000 for a new generator to support outside broadcasts. The **Boco Rock Community Enhancement Fund** is a very competitive grant. Decisions are expected to be announced in August 2024.

Saving the best news for last, our application for the Community Broadcasting Fund Round 1 2024/25 Development & Operations Grants was successful. We expect to receive \$12,147.00 plus GST in August 2024. This will support 2MNO in meeting the costs of transmission. Thank you to Pat Booker who once again prepared the CBF application.

I am also happy to organise an occasional raffle but from now on, however both Phil and I think the concerts are a better option. While we have the support of local entertainers we can run successful concerts. Thanks also to Fay and Margaret for helping me to man the door on concert nights. Also, thanks to the people who helped with raffles.

Technical Report for 2024 AGM.

This has been a busy year with a lot of work being done to keep our radio station going. A big thanks to Dave Miller and Harry Salmela for all that they have contributed by way of maintenance and installation. I have not been able to be of much use due to my health issues. However, Dave and Harry have kept me informed of all that has happened, they have been very active in keeping things going.

A major change in our Cooma operation is the installation of the electronic switching between Studio 1 & 2. This has streamlined our operation very nicely. Electronics were designed and built by Harry Salmela.

Our facilities have been upgraded by the installation of new mixing desks in Cooma and a more modern mixer at Nimmitabel. Computer systems in all studios have been upgraded to more modern systems. This aspect of the technical side of 2MNO operation is ongoing and under constant review. The new control systems for our equipment arc in operation now.

We have used our new Outside Broadcast equipment to good effect to enhance our public relations and show the 2MNO flag, the unit works well, thanks Dave.

Some general observations.

These notes are from a previous year and are worth repeating as some operating practices have been observed that would benefit from improved procedures and knowledge of how things work !

Your technical team recommend the following:-

Headphones are a must for efficient operating in studios.

If you use a computer as a source of your program material, Always have a back up CD ready in case of glitches with the computer. Put it in with a selected track ready to play before you do anything else prior to starting your show. Make sure you are familiar with the functions of the mixing desk. Remember that speaker monitoring is affected by the microphone faders. This is why we recommend the use of headphones so you can hear everything that you are doing.

Read the labelling on the desk. If you don't know what it all means, ask someone who does.

Make sure that the studio that you are about to close down as you finish is in working condition ready for the next presenter.

Have a plan " B " ready.

Rehearse everything you are going to do.
